

Ernie Sharpe – convicted 1994 – still a problem

Ernest (Ernie) Arnold Sharpe was charged March 28, 1994 by Woodstock, NB, RCMP and sentenced August 15 1994. After serving 2 years he was released. He and wife moved to AB for only a short period of time, then to London, ON.

The folks of the meeting home that he has been attending until last fall, have asked that he not attend. Workers are trying to find a local meeting home where he'll be permitted to attend.

Ernie states that he has a federal pardon. That hasn't been verified.

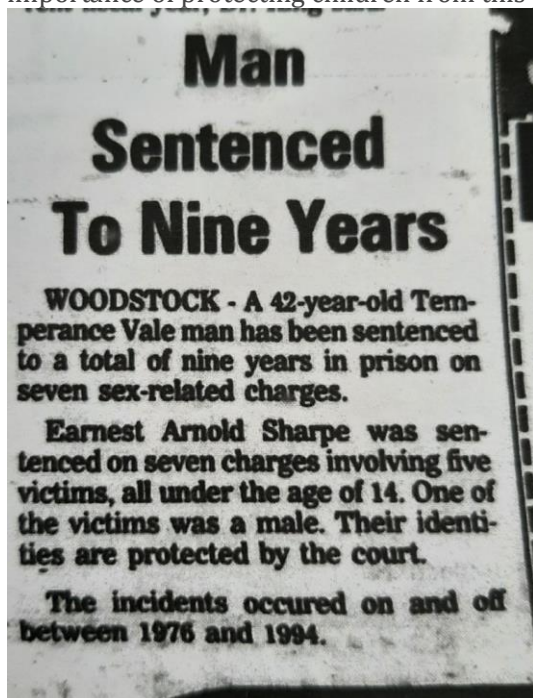
Friends in NB and ON understand that there are more than 30 victims, and possibly also some in AB.

Years ago, 2 of his daughters married and moved to USA, so now Ernie and his wife can travel to see grandchildren and go to meetings there.

In January 2024 Ernie came to NB to visit his brother. While there he harassed a victim (who was a child in 1994). She was terrified all over again.

At WINGS, we are concerned with the ongoing lack of understanding of the dangers of allowing known or credibly alleged child sexual abusers to participate in intimate fellowship gatherings. Denying access to abusers from children is not an indictment of their relationship with God, it is simply a risk management tool.

We encourage any survivors who have strength to step forward, so workers could begin to understand the importance of protecting children from this person and any other perpetrators.
